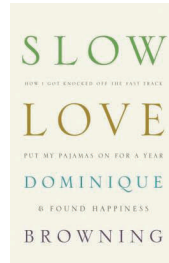


Featured Event: Free Author Program

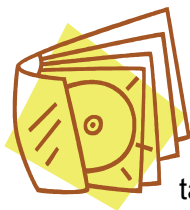

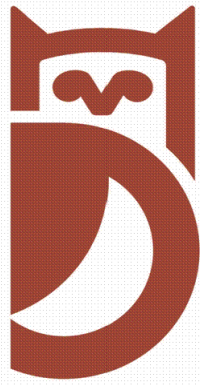
Check out the displays featuring banned books, pick up a free bookmark, and participate by reading a banned book during that week.
